Ladies and Gentlemen of the City Council:

I am very pleased to appoint Matthew O. Smith, of 12 Northey Street in Salem, to serve as the City's first Traffic and Parking Executive Director, pursuant to the City Ordinances Article VIII, Division 2, for a two-year term to commence November 14, 2016 and expire January 31, 2019.

Mr. Smith is a resident of Salem, a member of the Salem Redevelopment Authority, and an urban planner with over a decade of experience. He has worked in both the public and private sector on transportation projects, community planning, and economic development initiatives. Just as important, Mr. Smith brings an understanding of and passion for the City of Salem. He holds a Bachelor's degree from the Newhouse School of Public Communications at Syracuse University and a Master of Urban Planning degree from Hunter College of the City University of New York.

Mr. Smith is currently a planning consultant for the New York-based firm AKRF. As a Technical Director for the firm he works closely with municipalities, state agencies, and private sector clients on transportation initiatives, redevelopment planning, economic analyses, and environmental assessments. His projects are conducted with an attention toward analyzing the connectivity, parking, land use, and economic impacts associated with them. His local knowledge is also considerable. When he was the Senior Economic Development Planner for MAPC he managed numerous community and economic planning initiatives in the region, including among them the Salem Point Neighborhood Market Study. In all of the numerous studies in which he was involved transportation, connectivity, and parking accessibility were fundamental components.

I believe that Mr. Smith will be a thoughtful and highly competent Director of Traffic and Parking. He has the skills and expertise to help advise the new Traffic and Parking Commission, to set up the processes and systems necessary to establishing the new regulations in partnership with the City Council, and the background to be able to oversee the implementation and updating of important City traffic policies like our Complete Streets Policy, our Residential Traffic Calming Program, and our Comprehensive Parking Plan, among others. I hope you will join me in welcoming Mr. Smith to our team and will vote to confirm his appointment.

Dear Mayor Driscoll:

Engine 5, located at Station 5, 64 Loring Avenue is due to be retired from service. This engine is a 1995 Pierce Saber heading into its 22nd year of service with 100,000 miles. We had discussed the replacement of Engine 5 in the 2018 fiscal year from the Capital Improvement Program. To expedite the build process on this pump, I am requesting you enter into a lease purchase agreement with Ferrara Fire Apparatus through Specialty Vehicles, Inc. their local distributor, located in Attleboro, Ma. The normal build time for a custom pump is estimated at 300 day by most apparatus manufactures. By entering into an agreement now, Ferrara can place the Salem truck in the production schedule allowing for delivery by August of 2017. The first lease payment will be in arrears and not be due until one year from the lease date.

I respectfully request the approval of an appropriation from the FY18 CIP fund to support this purchase. Enclosed is the proposal from Specialty Vehicles for the truck and their lease terms from their leasing agent, Tax Exempt Leasing Corp.
