# PART 1. GENERAL INFORMATION

#### 1.1 PROCUREMENT DESCRIPTION

The Purchasing Department of the City of Salem, Massachusetts, on behalf of the Department of Public Works, is seeking bids for the installation of bituminous concrete, cement concrete and brick sidewalks, driveways, wheelchair ramps & granite curbing and bollards.

#### 1.2 APPLICABLE LAW

This procurement will be conducted pursuant to Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 30, Section 39M.

#### 1.3 APPROVAL

Any contract that may result from the procurement shall be subject to the approval of the Mayor of the City of Salem.

#### 1.4 INCORPORATION BY REFERENCE

All requirements, specifications, terms and conditions described in this Invitation for Bids shall be incorporated by reference into any contract that may result.

#### 1.5 TIME FOR AWARD

Any contract that may result from the procurement shall be awarded within thirty (30) days after the bid opening. The Contractor must agree to hold its bid prices firm for that period.

# 1.6 RIGHT TO CANCEL/REJECT

The City reserves the right to cancel this Invitation for Bids or reject in whole or in part any and all bids if the City determines that cancellation or rejection serves the best interests of the City.

#### 1.7 TAXATION

Purchases made by the City are exempt from the payment of Federal excise tax and the payment of Commonwealth of Massachusetts sales tax and any such taxes must not be included in the bid pricing.

Copies of the City's tax exempt paperwork shall be available upon request of the selected contractor.

#### 1.8 OBTAINING THE INVITATION FOR BIDS

The Invitation for Bids shall be available beginning, March 15, 2017.

The Invitation for Bids and related documents shall be available for free download from the City's Purchasing Department website at <a href="http://salem.com/purchasing">http://salem.com/purchasing</a> under "Open Procurements."

# PART 2. INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS

# 2.1 REQUIREMENTS AND SUBMISSIONS

Below please find a description of the requirements and submissions that must be included as part of a bid. Bids must be sealed and marked as noted.

#### 2.1.1 BID FORM

Every bid must include a completed 'Bid Form'. See attached. All material, equipment and labor is F.O.B. City of Salem.

#### 2.1.2 NON-COLLUSION

Every bid must include a certification of good faith, certifying that the bid was made in good faith and without collusion or fraud. See 'Non-Collusion Form' attached.

#### 2.1.3 TAX COMPLIANCE

Every bid must include a written certification that the bidder has complied with all state laws relating to taxes, reporting of employees and contractors, and child support. See 'Tax Compliance Form' attached.

#### 2.1.4 CORPORATE BIDDER

If the bid is being submitted by a corporation, the bid must include a certification that the individual submitting the bid has been authorized to bind the corporation. See 'Certificate of Corporate Authority' attached.

#### 2.1.5 REFERENCE FORM

Every bid must be accompanied by at least three (3) professional references.

#### 2.1.6 BID DEPOSIT

Each bid must be accompanied by a deposit equal to five percent (5%) of the amount of the bid. The bid deposit may be in the form of a certified treasurer's or cashier's check payable to the City of Salem from a responsible back or trust company; cash; or a bid bond.

#### 2.1.7 PAYMENT BOND

The selected contractor shall be required to furnish a Payment Bond in the amount of fifty percent (50%) of the contract price, within ten days of the date of notification of the contract award.

For the purposes of this bid, the "contract price" shall be defined as one third (1/3) of the total bid price listed on page 7.

#### 2.1.8 PREVAILING WAGE

Wages for this project are subject to the prevailing wage rates as set by the Department of Labor Standards. A copy of the prevailing wage rates for this project is included in the Invitation for Bids, along with a Payroll Record Form and Statement of Compliance.

In the event that the option to renew is exercised, an updated prevailing wage rate sheet will be sent to the Contractor along with the contract amendment letter.

Certified Weekly Payroll documents shall be sent to the Office of the Purchasing Agent, 93 Washington Street, 2<sup>nd</sup> Floor, Salem, MA 01970. Payroll records must be sent three (3) business days after the close of the previous work week. See 'Certification Regarding Payment of Prevailing Wage Rates' attached.

#### 2.1.9 DEBARMENT

Every bid must include a certification regarding the contractor's debarment status. A debarred contractor is not eligible or the award of public contracts during the period of its debarment. See 'Certification Regarding Debarment' attached.

#### 2.1.10 LABOR HARMONY AND OSHA CERTIFICATION

Every bid must include a certification regarding labor harmony training approved by the U.S. Occupation Safety and Health Administration completed by all employees to be employed at the worksite. See 'Labor Harmony and OSHA Certification' attached.

#### 2.2 BID DELIVERY

Below please find a description of the manner in which sealed bids must be submitted.

#### 2.2.1 DUE DATE AND TIME

Bids shall be received by the Office of the Purchasing Agent on or before **2:00 PM, Thursday, April 6, 2017.** 

Any bid received after that time shall be rejected as non-responsive.

#### 2.2.2 ADDRESS

Sealed bids shall be delivered to the Office of the Purchasing Agent, 93 Washington Street, 2<sup>nd</sup> Floor, Salem MA 01970.

#### 2.2.3 HOURS OF OPERATION

#### 2.2.4 COPIES

Bidders must submit one (1) original and one (1) copy of the bid.

#### 2.2.5 LABELING

The outside of the envelope containing the sealed bid must be labeled with 1) the bid number 2) the bid opening date and time and 3) the name of the bidder.

#### 2.3 SIGNATURES

A bid must be signed as follows: 1) if the bidder is an individual, by her/him personally; 2) if the bidder is a partnership, by the name of the partnership, followed by the signature of each general partner; and 3) if the bidder is a corporation, by the authorized officer, whose signature must be attested to by the clerk/secretary of the corporation, and with the corporate seal affixed.

# 2.4 QUESTIONS, CHANGES, MODIFICATIONS AND WITHDRAWALS

#### 2.4.1 QUESTIONS/REQUESTS FOR CLARIFICATION

Questions concerning this Invitation for Bids must be submitted in writing to: Whitney Haskell at whaskell@salem.com at least five (5) days prior to the bid opening date. Written responses will be mailed to all bidders on record as having picked up the Invitation for Bids.

#### 2.4.2 CHANGES

If any changes are made to this Invitation for Bids, addenda will be issued. Addenda will be posted in the Office of the Purchasing Agent, on the website and e-mailed to all bidders on record as having picked up the Invitation for Bids.

#### 2.4.3 MODIFICATIONS AND WITHDRAWALS

A bidder may correct, modify, or withdraw a bid by written notice received by the City of Salem prior to the time and date set for bid opening.

Modifications must be submitted in a sealed envelope clearly labeled "Modification No.\_\_" to the address listed in part one of this section. Each modification must be numbered in sequence, and must reference the Invitation for Bids.

After the bid opening a bidder may not change any provision of the bid in a manner prejudicial to the interests of the City or fair competition. Minor informalities will be waived or the bidder will be allowed to correct them. If a mistake and the intended bid are clearly evident on the face of the bid document, the mistake will be corrected to reflect the intended correct bid, and the bidder will be notified in writing; the bidder may not withdraw the bid. A bidder may withdraw a bid if a mistake is clearly evident on the face of the bid document, but the intended correct bid is not similarly evident.

#### 2.5 UNFORESEEN OFFICE CLOSURES

If, at the time of the scheduled bid opening, 93 Washington Street, 2nd Floor, Salem, MA 01970, is closed due to uncontrolled events such as fire, snow, ice, wind, or building evacuation, the bid opening will be postponed until 2:00 PM on the next normal business day. Bids will be accepted until that date and time.

#### 2.6 BID OPENING PROCEDURE

At the time and place fixed for opening of bids, the City will cause to be opened and publicly read aloud every bid received within the time set for receiving bids, irrespective of any irregularities therein. Bidders and other persons properly interested may be present, in person or by representative.

# PART 3. SCOPE OF WORK

#### SECTION I: GENERAL WORK SHALL INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING:

#### A. Excavation:

Excavate the existing driveway, sidewalks and wheelchair ramps, properly and legally dispose of all wheelchair ramps, curb or loam and excavated material.

#### B. Sub-Base for Driveways, Sidewalks & Wheelchair Ramps, Footings:

Preparation of the sub-base shall include the excavation of any tree roots when necessary, fine grading, and shaping the subgrade parallel to the proposed finish surface of the sidewalk or driveway and thoroughly compacting it. All depressions occurring shall be filled with crusher run stone and again compacted until the surface is smooth and hard. Sub-base shall be no less than six inches (6") deep and is to be included in the square yard price. In cases where further excavation is required, sub-base material shall be paid under the Gravel Borrow item.

# C. Wheelchair Ramps:

See attached sheets for wheelchair ramp details. All wheelchair ramps must conform to the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and the Architectural Access Board (AAB) Standards and Regulations. All sidewalk construction shall conform to the Massachusetts Highway Department Wheelchair Ramp Standards, revised 10-8-97, or the latest revision. The contractor is responsible for layout of all work and ensuring compliance with all applicable handicap laws. Work not conforming to applicable standards will not be accepted or paid for.

#### D. Installation:

- 1. Sidewalk, driveway, wheelchair ramps; See Section II for Bituminous Concrete and Section IV for Cement Concrete and Brick.
- 2. Granite curb; see Section III for installation, resetting and removal

#### E. Restoration:

- 1. All repairs will be made at contractor's expense.
- 2. All damaged roadways, driveways and sidewalks will be restored to their original condition.
- 3. All grass and lawns damaged during the course of work shall be loamed and seeded.
- 4. All voids remaining between the existing lawn and the new driveways, sidewalks and curbs will be filled with loam and seeded.

## F. Safety:

- The Contractor will be responsible for supplying all necessary barricades and signs for blocking
  off and warning pedestrians and motorists of all hazards, in accordance with current MUTCD
  standards. The contractor shall be responsible for posting areas of no parking. The contractor
  shall be responsible for arranging Police details. The City will pay the cost of any Police details
  directly.
- 2. Once a sidewalk or driveway is excavated, it must be replaced within 4 working days, weather permitting.
- 3. No construction materials (excavated material, crusher run stone, etc.) may be placed on any

roadway surface without proper approval from the designated City representative.

4. Utility Locator Service: Contractor shall notify DigSafe for area where Project is located before site clearing.

#### G. Private Property:

The Contractor is responsible for all damage to private property. All property damaged will be repaired at the Contractor's expense. It is the Contractor's responsibility to document existing conditions.

# H. Specifications:

Any specifications not covered by this document will follow the Commonwealth of Massachusetts Department of Public Works Standard Specifications for Highway and Bridges 1989, Ed., and revisions.

# SECTION II: BITUMINOUS CONCRETE SIDEWALK, DRIVEWAYS AND WHEELCHAIR RAMPS

#### A. Material:

Class 1 Bituminous Concrete shall conform to the Commonwealth of Massachusetts Department of Public Works, Standard Specifications for Highways and Bridges, 1989 Ed., Section M3.11.00.

#### B. Excavation:

Excavation will follow Section I. Where the existing bituminous concrete sidewalks and driveways must be cut, they will be saw cut or cut with pneumatic tools to true neat lines as directed.

#### C. Placing Bituminous Concrete:

The bituminous concrete will be installed in two (2) courses to a depth of three (3) inches after rolling. The bottom course (binder course) shall be one and one-half  $(1\ 1/2)$  inches in thickness, and its surface after rolling shall be one and one-half  $(1\ 1/2)$  inches below, and parallel to, the proposed grade of the finished surfaces. The top course shall be one and one-half  $(1\ 1/2)$  inches in thickness after rolling. Unless otherwise directed, the surface shall have a pitch three sixteenths (3/16) of an inch per foot of width to provide for proper drainage.

# D. Rolling:

The surface shall be rolled with a self-propelled Tandem Roller weighing not less than one and one-half (1 1/2) tons and not more than five (5) tons. In places, inaccessible to a power roller, compaction shall be obtained by means of mechanical rammers or by hand tampers weighing not less than fifty (50) pounds and having a tamping face not exceeding one hundred (100) square inches.

#### E. Payment:

Bituminous concrete driveways, sidewalks and wheelchair ramps will be paid for at the contract unit price per square yard and include all work stated in Sections I and II.

## F. Payment Items:

Bituminous Concrete Sidewalk Square Yard

Bituminous Concrete Sidewalk at Driveways Square Yard

#### SECTION III: GRANITE CURB INSTALLATION, RESETTING AND REMOVAL

#### A. Excavating trench:

The trench for the curb shall be excavated to a depth below the proposed finished grade at the curb equal to six (6) inches plus the depth of the curb stone, and to a width extending six (6) inches beyond the front and back of curb.

## B. Preparing Foundation:

The foundation for the curb shall consist of crusher run stone which shall be spread upon the subgrade and, after being thoroughly compacted by tamping, shall be six (6) inches in depth.

#### C. Setting curb:

Curbing shall be set on gravel spread upon the foundation. All spaces under the curb shall be filled with gravel and thoroughly compacted so that the curb will be completely supported throughout its length. The curb shall be set at the line and grade as directed. The granite curb shall be fitted together as closely as possible and the joints filled with mortar. After the curb is set, a minimum of six (6) inches of cement concrete will be poured in front of the curb and the back of the curb will be filled with crusher run stone and thoroughly compacted. After the concrete has cured for twenty four (24) hours, the roadway will be patched with bituminous concrete and restored to its original condition.

#### D. Payment:

Granite curb installation, resetting and removal will be paid for at the contract unit price per linear foot and includes all work stated in Sections I and III and the following:

- 1. Resetting curb Remove existing granite curb and replace following specifications outlined in Sections I and III.
- 2. Removing curb and hauling Remove existing granite curb, haul and stack it at Salem's DPW Garage located at 5 Jefferson Avenue.
- 3. Installing old granite curb supplied by the City of Salem. This includes picking up old curb at the City of Salem's DPW Garage at 5 Jefferson Avenue or from the City's Transfer Station located on Swampscott Road and loading and hauling it to the installation location anywhere within Salem and installing the curb as specified in Sections I & III.
- 4. Installing new granite curb provided by the Contractor This includes the contractor supplying new type VA4 granite curb, hauling it to the installation location and installing it according to the specifications outlined in Section I & III.
- 5. Resetting Curb At Wheelchair Ramps This includes cutting and resetting the existing granite curb to form the proper grades as shown in detail sheet and installing the curb as specified in Sections I & III.

#### SECTION IV: CONCRETE AND BRICK SIDEWALKS, WHEELCHAIR RAMPS, AND DRIVEWAYS

This work shall consist of the construction of bituminous concrete or cement concrete sidewalks, wheelchair ramps and driveways in accordance with these specifications and in close conformity with the lines and grades shown on the plans or established by the Engineer.

#### A. Materials:

Materials shall meet the requirements specified in the following Subsections of Division III, Materials, of the Commonwealth on Massachusetts Department of Public Works Standard Specifications for Highways and Bridges:

Gravel Borrow M1.03.0 (type b)

Cement Concrete (Air-Entrained 4000psi.3/4",610) M4.02.00

Preformed Expansion Joint Filler M9.14.0

Class I Bituminous Concrete M3.11.00

Along with the requirements in Section IVb of this specification.

#### **CONSTRUCTION METHODS**

#### A. Sub-grade:

The sub-grade for the sidewalks, ramps and driveways shall be shaped parallel to the proposed surface of the walks, ramps and driveways and thoroughly compacted. All depressions occurring shall be filled with suitable material and again be compacted until the surface is smooth and hard.

#### **B.** Foundation:

After the sub-grade has been prepared, a foundation of gravel shall be placed upon it. After being compacted thoroughly, the foundation shall be at least 8 inches in thickness and parallel to the proposed surface of the walk.

#### SECTION IVa: CONCRETE SIDEWALKS AND WHEELCHAIR RAMPS:

#### A. Forms:

- 1. Side forms and transverse forms shall be smooth, free from warp, of sufficient strength to resist springing out of shape, of a depth to conform to the thickness of the proposed walk or ramp and of a type satisfactory to the Engineer.
- 2. All mortar or dirt shall be completely removed from forms that have been previously used. The forms shall be well staked and thoroughly graded to the established lines with their upper edge conforming to the grade of the finished walk or ramp which shall have sufficient pitch to the roadside edge to provide for surface drainage but not to exceed 2%.
- 3. All forms shall be oiled before placing concrete.

# B. Placing and Finishing Concrete.

1. The concrete shall be placed in alternate slabs 30 feet in length except as otherwise ordered. The slabs shall be separated by transverse preformed expansion joint filler 1/2 inch in thickness.

- 2. Preformed expansion joint filler shall be placed adjacent to or around existing structures as directed, and between driveway and sidewalk sections.
- 3. On the foundation as specified above, the concrete shall be placed in such quantity that after being thoroughly consolidated in place it shall be 4 inches in depth. At driveways, the sidewalks shall be 6 inches in depth. No finishing operation shall be performed while free water is still present. Finishing operations shall be delayed until all bleed water and water sheen has left the surface and the concrete has started to stiffen. After water sheen has disappeared, edging operations, where required, shall be completed. After edging and joining operations, the surface shall be floated. Immediately following floating, the surface shall be steel-trowled. If necessary tooled joints and edges shall be rerun before and after troweling to maintain uniformity. After troweling, the surface shall be brushed by drawing a soft-bristled push broom with a long handle over the surface of the concrete to produce a non-slip surface.
- 4. In conveying the concrete from the place of mixing to the place of deposit, the operation shall be conducted in such a manner that no mortar will be lost, and the concrete shall be so handled that the concrete will be of uniform composition throughout, showing neither excess nor lack of mortar in any one place.
- 5. The surface of all concrete sidewalks shall be uniformly scored into block units of areas not more than 36 square feet. The depth of the scoring shall be at least one quarter of the thickness of the sidewalk.
- 6. The application of neat cement to surfaces in order to hasten hardening is prohibited.
- 7. The finishing of concrete surface shall be done by experienced and competent cement finishers approved by the Engineer.
- 8. When completed, the walks shall be kept moist and protected from traffic and weather for at least three 3 days in accordance with the applicable provisions of Subsection 476.74. of the of the Commonwealth on Massachusetts Department of Public Works Standard Specifications for Highways and Bridges

#### **PAYMENT**

#### A. Method of Measurement:

1. Concrete walks and wheelchair ramps will be measured in square yards.

# B. Basis of Payment:

1. Concrete Sidewalks, Wheelchair Ramps and Sidewalks at Driveways will be paid for at the contract unit price per square yard and include all work stated in Sections I and II.

#### C. Payment Items:

Concrete Sidewalk Square Yard

Concrete Sidewalk at Driveways Square Yard

Concrete Wheel Chair Ramp Square Yard

# SECTION IVb: CONCRETE SIDEWALKS WITH BRICK BAND, DRIVES AND WHEELCHAIR RAMPS:

The work to be done under this Item shall conform to the relevant provisions and requirements of Section 700 of the Standard Specifications and as follows:

#### A. Materials:

- 1. Compacted granular base course shall conform to Section 405, Gravel Base Course, except that Gravel Borrow shall be Type c, M1.03.0.
- 2. Cement concrete shall conform to M4.02.00, Cement Concrete (Air entrained 4000psi, 3/4",610). Submit manufacturer's data to Engineer for approval.
- 3. The thickness of concrete drives shall be 8".
- 4. Drives and sidewalks shall be reinforced with welded steel wire mesh. Welded steel wire mesh shall conform to M8.01.2 of the Standard Specifications, AASHTO-M32. Submit manufacturer's data to Engineer for approval.
- 5. Brick, latex modified mortar, and joint filler shall be as specified under Item 708 Brick Pavement.
- 6. Expansion joint filler shall be preformed, non-bituminous type joint filler conforming to ASTM D 1752, Type II. Premolded joint filler shall be one piece for the full depth and width of the joint. Use of multiple pieces of lesser dimension to make up required depth and width of joint will not be permitted. Except as otherwise noted on the Drawings, joint filler shall be 1/2" thick.
- 7. Expansion joints shall receive joint backer rod and shall be sealed with joint sealant. Joint backer rod shall consist of two rows of butyl rubber or neoprene foam rod in contact with original width when in place. All such materials shall be of the type which shall not bleed through sealant, discolor its surface, or produce other deleterious effects.
- 8. Sealant for expansion joints shall be a non-straining two component polyurethane based sealant conforming to Fed. Specifications TT-S-00227, Class A, and ASTM C920, Type M, Grade P, Class 25, Use T, with a Shore A Hardness of 30+ or better. Color of Sealant shall be reasonably close in color recommended by the sealant manufacturer, and sealant and primer shall be products of the same manufacturer.

#### **B.** Construction Methods:

- 1. Preparation of sub-grade under paving shall conform to Subsections 170.61 and 170.60 of the Standard Specifications.
- 2. Where the base course under existing sidewalks is acceptable to the Engineer, recompact existing base and bring to grade by addition of new material. Base course construction shall conform to the Subsection 401.60 of the Standard Specifications.
- 3. Where new concrete sidewalks abut existing bituminous paving at the back of sidewalk, the edge of the new concrete shall be formed. Where back of new sidewalk abuts building, curbs, or concrete paving there shall be an expansion joint.
- 4. Before tree pits are formed in concrete, the Contractor shall stake all tree pit locations and shall determine by appropriate probing or other means, that no utility obstructions will be met. If any are evident in the selected locations, the Engineer shall be notified and shall relocate these planting locations. The Contractor shall then adjust stakes and make the appropriate probes in all

new locations until satisfactory locations are found. The Contractor shall supply all stakes, probes, labor and incidentals required to complete the field's layout of proposed plant locations. The Contractor shall be responsible for the protection and repair, if necessary, of all underground utilities or structures encountered during the planting operations.

- 5. Brick for brick band and at base of lights shall be mortar set "Salem Pavers". Brick shall be as specified herein, and shall conform to all the requirements of the Brick Pavement Item, in regards to submittals, materials and construction. Concrete underneath the brick band shall be finished with a rough finish to provide for a mortar bond.
- 6. Sidewalks shall be scored in accordance with the pattern shown on the Drawings and Details and Subsection 476.68 of the Standard Specifications.
- 7. Concrete sidewalks and drives shall be finished with a light broom finish, except at handicap ramps which shall have a rough broom finish, in the directions shown on the Details. Broom finish of sidewalks and drive shall be perpendicular to the curbline.

#### C. Payment:

Concrete Sidewalks with brick band shall be measured and paid for at the Contract Unit Price per square yard. This measurement shall include handicap ramps, concrete drives, concrete sidewalk, brick band, and brick base of lights. The contract unit price shall be full compensation for all labor, equipment, tools and incidentals, necessary to complete this item in place to the satisfaction of the Engineer. The contract unit price shall include fine-grading and compaction if the sub-grade, compaction of the base course, installation of concrete and brick, and finishing of the concrete sidewalk. Gravel borrow for base course shall be paid for under contract unit price for Gravel Borrow.

#### SECTION IVc: BRICK PAVEMENT AND BRICK EDGED SIDEWALK

- 1. The work to be done under this Item includes, but is not limited to; installation of mortared brick sidewalk paving and mortared brick crosswalks.
- 2. Design details for the brick wheelchair ramp shall conform to the latest standard for wheelchair ramps of the MDPW.
- 3. The work to be done under this Item shall conform to the relevant provisions and requirements of the Standard Specifications and as follows:

#### A. Submittals:

- 1. Submit manufacturer's specifications with certified copies of laboratory test reports and other data as may be required to show compliance with the requirements specified herein.
- 2. Submit samples consisting of a sufficient number of units to show the full range of variations in color and texture, but in no case less than five bricks.
- 3. Submit manufacturer's data for latex-modified additive.
- 4. Submit manufacturer's or supplier's data for sand and cement.

#### B. Mock-Up:

Build a sample panel of herring bone pattern bricks, and obtain the approval of the Engineer before proceeding with the final work. The sample panel shall remain undisturbed until all paving is completed. Remove panel upon completion of paving.

#### C. Materials:

- 1. Brick pavers for use on sidewalks and cross-walks shall be City Hall pavers, as manufactured by Stiles and Hart, Bridgewater, MA, or approved equal, except that the color mix shall conform to the City of Salem standard brick known as "Salem Pavers".
- 2. Size shall be 3-1/2" wide x 7-3/4" long x 2-1/4" deep.
- 3. Brick shall be sand-molded, conforming to ASTM C-902-79A, ASTM Specification C31, Grade SX, Abrasion Type 1, PA with eight (8) percent average water absorption and average eight thousand (8,000) P.S.I. compressive strength. Freeze thaw testing shall be fifty (50) cycles.
- 4. All bricks shall be shipped packaged and/or palletized in accordance with manufacturer's standard packaging procedures.
- 5. Mortar for setting bed shall conform to ASTM C270, Type S, except that latex polymer additive shall be mixed with the cementitious materials and aggregate according to the manufacturer's instructions.
- 6. Latex polymer additive shall be Laticrete 3701, manufactured by Laticrete International, Woodbridge, CT, or approved equal.
- 7. Joint filler shall contain a coloring additive. Submit color sample to the Engineer for approval by the Landscape Architect. Coloring additive shall be SGS Colors, manufactured by Solomon Grind Chem Service, Springfield, Illinois or approved equal. Color pigment shall not exceed 10% of the Portland cement in the mortar. Mortar coloring additive shall have mineral oxide pigment and shall be certified by the supplier to be resistant to alkali, light, and weather, and shall be of a chemical composition unaffected by cement and free of water and soluble salts.
- 8. Joint filler shall be two and one-half (2-1/2) cubic feet of fine sand, one (1) bag (94 pounds) Portland Cement, one (1) bag coloring and mixed according to manufacturer's recommendations.

#### D. Construction:

- 1. BEFORE INSTALLATION OF BRICK PAVING, CONCRETE BASE SLAB SHALL HAVE BEEN FULLY CURED, and shall have been approved by the Engineer.
- All masonry shall be laid by skilled workmen under adequate supervision and shall by laid true to lines and levels, with joints of uniform thickness, all surfaces true, and corners straight and plumb.
- 3. The Contractor shall inspect the concrete base slabs and assure him/herself that they are in proper condition, are the proper level and have the proper pitch to receive the paving. The Contractor shall notify the Engineer before any work is installed of any condition requiring correction.
- 4. Mixing: Mix sand and cement with a standard batch mixer or mortar box. Add Laticrete 3701 proportion and mix to a mortar of medium consistency. Mix thoroughly and allow mixture to stand for ten minutes and re-mix before applying. Pot life will vary with temperature and humidity and should be mixed occasionally during use.
- 5. Setting bed as specified shall be of a semi-rough finish, water cured and slope to drain. Surface must be clean, free from grease and other impurities, without projections, depressions, holes,

- joints, loose or friable particles. Thoroughly wet slab before installing bricks. Damp dry concrete shall be coated with a bond coat of Laticrete 3701 and neat cement water prior to placement of traditional mud setting bed, which shall be placed in the traditional manner, per manufacturer's specifications.
- 5. The bricks shall have a low rate of suction at the time they are laid; to secure this low rate of suction, the bricks shall be thoroughly wetted and not allowed to dry out. The section of the bricks shall be so reduced that specimens of brick, taken at the time of setting, shall not gain more than twenty (20) grams in weight when placed in one-eighth (1/8) to one-quarter (1/4) inch of water for one (1) minute.
- 6. Dip, brush, or paint a mixture of cement and Laticrete 3701 Latex on the back of each prewetted paver and set the paver into freshly installed mud setting bed, beating the paver, level and true. Leveling of the paver should be done as the setting operation proceeds so that it is not necessary to disturb the pavers set earlier. Grouting should not be done until the underbed sets and hardens (24 hours or more).
- 7. The brick pavers shall be laid in the pattern shown on the Drawings. Use a saw to cut the bricks as necessary for irregular shapes to complete the patterns as shown on the Drawings. Joints between brick pavers shall be three-eighths (3/8) inch wide.
- 8. Paving bricks shall be kept clean and joints between bricks shall be clean and open to the full depth of the paving bricks until the joint is filled with cement mortar and hand tooled.
- 9. After a sufficient area of brick pavement has been laid, the surface shall be tested with a ten foot (10') straight-edge and any variation exceeding three-eighths inch (3/8") shall be corrected and be brought to the proper grade. Each section of brick pavement shall be acceptable to the Engineer before it is mortared.
- 10. No masonry work shall be laid in temperatures below forty degrees Fahrenheit unless provisions are made to protect adequately the masonry materials and the finished work from frost by heating materials, enclosing the work and heating the enclosed space. All masonry materials used in freezing weather shall be at a temperature between fifty (50) degrees and ninety (90) degrees Fahrenheit. The mortar shall have a temperature between sixty (60) and eighty (80) degrees Fahrenheit. Protect masonry against freezing for at least forty-eight (48) hours after being laid. Antifreeze admixtures will not be allowed in the mortar. No frozen soil or frozen work shall be built upon.

#### E. Expansion Joints:

Expansion joints shall be as indicated on the Drawings, and shall extend completely through the paver and setting bed at all structural joints and areas. Joints shall be filled a minimum one-half inch (1/2") deep with joint filler. All joints shall be tooled as selected by the Engineer.

## F. Joint Filler:

Joint filler as specified shall be mixed to a standard, stiff, workable grout (a slurry of medium consistency). With a squeegee or trowel, spread joint filler back and forth across the paver faces until the joints are filled and firmly packed. Clean with rubber squeegee, sponge or burlap in the traditional manner. Once joint filler has taken a firm set, clean with damp sawdust.

#### G. Cleaning and Finishing:

- 1. All exposed masonry surfaces shall be thoroughly cleaned with a solution of mild soap and water using stiff fiber brushes. In extreme cases a five percent (5%) solution of muriatic acid may be used for cleaning paving, but this shall be preceded by and followed by a copious bath of fresh clean water.
- 2. Rake out all imperfect mortar joints and re-point as directed by the Engineer. The entire work shall be left in perfect condition, free of all blemishes.

- 3. The Contractor shall be responsible for closing off traffic to avoid damage to all brickwork until mortar has been set.
- 4. The Contractor shall provide complete protection against breakage, staining and weather damage to masonry.
- 5. Special care shall be taken to properly protect pavings immediately after installation against sudden adverse weather and rapid drying during hot weather.

## H. Payment:

#### Method of Measurement:

Brick crosswalks and brick sidewalk paving shall be measured and paid for at the Contract unit price per square yard. Square Yardage of brick crosswalks is an actual area of brick paving. Brick Wheelchair Ramps will be measured individually and shall be paid for at the Contract unit price for Wheelchair Ramps.

#### **Basis of Payment:**

The Contract Unit Price per square yard for brick crosswalks shall be full compensation for all labor, equipment, tools and incidentals, necessary to complete the item in place to the satisfaction of the Engineer. This unit price shall include, in addition to furnishing and installing the brick complete in place, cement concrete base, the compaction of sub-grade and reinforcing.

#### SECTION V: REMOVAL AND REPAIR OF EXISTING BRICK PAVEMENT:

- 1. The work under this Item includes the removal and repair of existing brick surfaces, wherever necessary to install proposed site improvements under this Contract.
- 2. Existing brick shall be carefully removed to the extant necessary for construction of the improvements and stockpiled at the City Garage (5 Jefferson Ave.) for reuse.
- 3. Except at Wheelchair ramps, brick shall not be sawcut to allow for new improvements but shall be removed brick by brick.
- 4. Replace gravel and base course where this has been disturbed.
- 5. Brick shall be re-installed matching existing installation techniques in all respects. Method of installation to match existing shall be approved by the Engineer before proceeding. Brick shall be reinstalled in conformity with Brick Pavement and Brick Edge Sidewalk Items, and shall be sawcut where necessary to fit it to new improvements.
- 6. New brick, if necessary, shall match existing brick in every respect. Brick shall be installed in conformity with Brick Pavement and Brick Edge Sidewalk Items within these specifications.

#### **SECTION VI: BOLLARD INSTALLATION**

## A. Submittals:

- 1. Submit manufacturer's product literature and other data as may be required to show compliance with the requirements specified herein.
- **B.** Bollard Footings: Footings for bollards shall be provided to size per Drawings and manufacturer's installation requirements:
  - 1. Forms:

- a. Forms shall be smooth, free from warp, of sufficient strength to resist springing out of shape, of a depth to conform to the thickness of the proposed footing and of a type satisfactory to the Engineer.
- b. All bollards shall be staked out and locations approved by the Engineer prior to placement of footings.
- c. Place and secure forms plumb and to correct location, dimension, and profile. Adequately brace to withstand loads applied during concrete placement.

#### 2. Materials:

- a. Compacted granular base course shall conform to Section 405, Gravel Base Course, except that Gravel Borrow shall be Type c, M1.03.0.
- b. Cement concrete shall conform to M4.02.00, Cement Concrete (Air entrained 4000psi, 3/4",610). Submit manufacturer's data to Engineer for approval.

# 3. Placing Concrete:

- a. In conveying the concrete from the place of mixing to the place of deposit, the operation shall be conducted in such a manner that no mortar will be lost, and the concrete shall be so handled that the concrete will be of uniform composition throughout, showing neither excess nor lack of mortar in any one place.
- b. Place concrete in accordance with ACI 301, 302, and 304. Minimize handling to prevent segregation. Consolidate concrete by suitable means to prevent formation of voids or honeycombs. Exercise care to prevent disturbance of forms and reinforcing and damage to vapor retarder. Place concrete to lines and levels shown, properly sloped to drain as designed.
  - i. Hot Weather Placement: ACI 305.
  - ii. Cold Weather Placement: ACI 306.
  - iii. Ensure reinforcement and embedded parts are not disturbed during concrete placement.

#### C. Bollard Installation:

 Bollard products shall be as selected by the City. Install embedded bollards per manufacturer's recommendations and as detailed on Drawings. Refer to manufacturer for minimum embedment in concrete footing.

Tolerance: Allowable variation from true plumb, level and line shall be no more than 1/8" in 20'-0".

# PART 4. EVALUATION AND SELECTION

# 4.1 MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS

- 1. The Bidder shall be regularly engaged in the type of work described herein.
- 2. The Bidder shall have a minimum of five years of experience.
- 3. The Bidder must provide at least references.

# 4.2 RULE FOR AWARD

Any contract that results from the procurement shall be awarded to the lowest responsible and eligible bidder, offering the lowest price on the "Bid Form."

# PART 5. TERMS AND CONDITIONS

### 5.1 TERM OF CONTRACT

The performance period for any contract that results from this Invitation for Bids shall commence on or around April 15, 2017 and terminate April 15, 2018 with the option to renew for up two years in one-year increments.

#### 5.2 ASSIGNMENTS AND SUBCONTRACTING

The selected vendor shall not assign, sell, subcontract or otherwise transfer any interest in this contract without the prior written consent of the City. The successful bidder shall be fully responsible to the City for the acts and omissions of his subcontractor, and of persons either directly or indirectly employed by them, as he is for the acts and omissions of persons directly employed by him.

#### 5.3 PAYMENT

The City shall make every effort to furnish payment within thirty (30) days of receipt of a reasonably detailed invoice. Any invoice received must reference the contract number. Nothing contained in the contract shall create any contractual relation between any subcontractor and the City of Salem. The Successful Bidder shall cause appropriate provision to be inserted in all subcontracts relative to the work to require compliance by each subcontractor with the application provisions of the Contract for the improvements embraced in the site preparation.

Invoicing for all work must be done weekly and must be accompanied by copies of original bills for material used. Billing must separate labor and itemize materials

Weekly payroll record forms and signed statement of compliance must be submitted with all billing.

#### 5.4 INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

General- The Vendor shall before commencing performance of the Contract be responsible for providing and maintaining insurance coverage in force for the life of the Contract of the kind and in adequate amounts to secure all of the obligations under the Contract and with insurance companies licensed to write insurance in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. All such insurance carried shall not be less than the kinds and amounts designated herein, and the Vendor agrees that the stipulation herein of the kinds and limits of coverage shall in no way limit the liability of the Vendor to any such kinds and amounts of insurance coverage. All policies issued shall indemnify and save harmless the City of Salem, its agents and employees from any and all claims for damages to persons or property as may rise out of the performance of this Contract.

Vendor's Comprehensive General Public Liability and Property Damage Liability Insurance - The Vendor shall carry Comprehensive General Liability Insurance providing for a limit of not less than Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) for all damages arising out of bodily injury to or death of one person, and subject to that limit for each person, a total limit of not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) for all damages arising out of bodily injuries or death of two or more persons in any one accident; and Vendor's Comprehensive Property Damage Liability Insurance providing for a limit of not less than Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) for all damages arising out of injury to or destruction of property in any one accident, and subject to that limit per accident, a

total (or aggregate) limit or not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) for all damages arising out of injury to or destruction of property during the policy period.

Comprehensive Automotive and Property Damage Insurance - The Vendor shall carry Automobile Insurance covering all owned vehicles, hired vehicles or non-owned vehicles under the control of the Vendor while performing work under the Contract in the amount of not less than Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) for all damages arising out of bodily injuries to or death of one person and subject to that limit for each person, a total of not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) for all damages arising out of bodily injuries to or death of two or more persons in any one accident; and Property Damage coverage in the amount of not less than Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) for all damages to or destruction of property.

The Vendor must carry Workman's Compensation Insurance in the amounts prescribed under Massachusetts State Law and meet all other City and State Laws and Regulations.

No cancellation(s) of such insurance, whether by the insurer or by the insured party shall be valid unless written notice thereof is given by the parties proposing cancellation to the other party and to the City of Salem at least fifteen (15) days prior to the intended effective date thereof, which date shall be expressed in said notice, which shall be sent by registered mail, return receipt requested. These provisions shall apply to the legal representative(s), trustee in bankruptcy, receiver, assignee, trustee, and successor(s) in interest of the Vendor.

All insurance coverage shall be at the sole expense of the Vendor and shall be placed with such company as may be acceptable to the City of Salem and shall constitute a material part of the contract documents.

Failure to provide written proof to City and continue in force such insurance as aforesaid shall be deemed a material breach of the contract, and may constitute sufficient grounds for immediate termination of the same.

#### 5.5 CHANGE ORDERS AND ADJUSTMENTS

Any request for a change order or adjustment must be submitted in writing and contain, an explanation of the need for the change order, a statement of work including a cost breakdown of each addition, and a statement that the change order is in the best interest of the awarding authority. The City is not obligated to pay for change orders that are not approved in writing, by the original contract signatories. Three (3) copies of the change order shall be required.

#### 5.6 INDEMNIFICATION

Unless otherwise provided by law, the Vendor will indemnify and hold harmless the City against any and all liability, loss, damages, costs or expenses for personal injury or damage to real or tangible personal property which the City may sustain, incur or be required to pay, arising out of or in connection with the performance of the Contract by reason of any negligent action/inaction or willful misconduct by the Contractor, its agents, servants or employees.

#### 5.7 FEDERAL AND STATE LAW

The selected contractor shall comply with all applicable Federal, State and Local laws and ordinances.

#### 5.8 STATEMENT OF WORK

Except as otherwise specifically stated in the bid and contract documents the selected contractor shall secure, at its own expense, all necessary permits and licenses and comply with all city and state codes and regulations. The selected contractor shall provide and pay for all materials, equipment, labor, tools, temporary construction of every nature, charges, levies, fees, or other expenses incurred and all other services and facilities of every nature whatsoever for his performance of the Contract within the specified time, and required for this project. The selected contractor must provide all materials and equipment free of any lien, claim or encumbrance.

For Cause. If the CONTRACTOR is determined by the CITY to be in default of any term or condition of CONTRACT, the CITY may terminate this contract on thirty (30) days notice by providing notice to the CONTRACTOR, which shall be in writing and shall be deemed delivered and received when given in person to the CONTRACTOR, or when received by fax, express mail, certified mail return receipt requested, regular mail postage prepaid or delivered by any other appropriate method evidencing actual receipt by the CONTRACTOR. If the CITY is determined by the CONTRACTOR to be in default of any term or condition of this CONTRACT the CONTRACTOR may terminate this contract on thirty (30) days notice by providing notice to the CITY, which shall be in writing and shall be deemed delivered and received when given in person to the CITY, or when received by fax, express mail, certified mail return receipt requested, regular mail postage prepaid or delivered by any other appropriate method evidencing actual receipt by the CITY.

<u>Default</u>. The following shall constitute events of default under this CONTRACT: a) any material misrepresentation made by the CONTRACTOR to the CITY, b) any failure to perform any of its obligations under this CONTRACT including, but not limited to the following: (i) failure to commence performance of this CONTRACT at the time specified in this CONTRACT due to a reason or circumstance within the CONTRACTOR'S reasonable control, (ii) failure to perform this CONTRACT with sufficient personnel and equipment or with sufficient material to ensure the completion of this CONTRACT within the specified time due to a reason or circumstance within the

CONTRACT or reasonable control, (iii) failure to performance this CONTRACT in a manner reasonably satisfactory to the CITY, (iv) failure to promptly re-perform with reasonable time the services that were rejected by the CITY as unsatisfactory, or erroneous, (v) discontinuance of the services for reasons not beyond the CONTRACTOR'S reasonable control, (vi) failure to comply with a material term of this CONTRACT, including, but not limited to, the provision of insurance and nondiscrimination, and (vii) any other acts specifically and expressly stated in this CONTRACT as constituting a basis for termination of this CONTRACT, and (viii) failure to comply with any and all requirements of state law, and/or regulations, and City ordinances, and/or regulations.

#### ARTICLE V. REMEDIES OF THE CITY.

The CITY may deduct the cost of any substitute contract or performance for expenses, losses, and all damages, including incidental and consequential damages as a result of any event of non-conformance or non-performance of the CONTRACTOR in complying with the terms of this CONTRACT, and shall withhold such expenses, losses, and damages from sums due, or to become due.

#### ARTICLE VI. REMEDIES OF THE CONTRACTOR.

If the damages, other than loss, non-conformance, or non-performance, are actually sustained by the CONTRACTOR due to any act or omission for which the CITY is legally responsible the CITY shall allow a sum equal to the amount of such damages sustained by the Contractor as determined by the CITY in writing, provided the Contractor shall have provided to all signatories of the contract a detailed written statement of such damages and cause thereof within 30 days of the act of omission by the CITY.

#### ARTICLE VII. ASSIGNABILITY.

The CONTRACTOR shall not assign, subcontract or in any way transfer any interest in this contract without the prior written consent of the Procurement Officer of said City. In the event of such occurrence the City reserves the right to deal with any assignee subcontractor or transferee directly and the contractor agrees to remain bound by all terms and conditions of this contract in accordance with its original tenor. The provisions of this CONTRACT shall be binding upon, and shall inure to the benefit of, the successors and assigns of the CONTRACTOR and any public body or bodies succeeding the interests of the CITY.

# ARTICLE VIII. INDEMNIFICATION.

The CONTRACTOR shall assume the defense, indemnify and hold harmless the CITY, the CITY'S agents and employees, from and against all losses and all claims, demands, payments, suits, actions, recoveries and judgments of every nature and description brought or recovered against them by reason of acts, in actions, omissions, negligence, reckless or intentional misconduct of the said CONTRACTOR, its agent(s), officers, employees, or subcontractors; in the execution of the work or in guarding the same. Unless otherwise provided by law, the CITY may elect to indemnify the CONTRACTOR for claims arising in tort if it is determined that the CONTRACTOR performed its obligations under this CONTRACT pursuant to the direct supervision and control of the CITY or its designated agent(s).

#### ARTICLE IX. WORKER'S COMPENSATION AND OTHER INSURANCE.

The CONTRACTOR shall provide by insurance for the payment of compensation and the furnishing of other benefits under Chapter 152 of the General Laws of Massachusetts (The Worker's Compensation Act) to all employees of the CONTRACTOR who are subject to the provisions of Chapter 152 of the General Laws of Massachusetts.

Failure to provide and continue in force such insurance during the period of this contract shall be deemed a material breach of this contract, shall operate as an immediate termination thereof, and CONTRACTOR shall indemnify the CITY for all losses, claims, and actions resulting from the failure to provide the insurance required by this Article. Prior to commencement of any work and until completion of its work under this CONTRACT shall maintain the following insurance coverage, at its cost, from insurance acceptable to the CITY, giving evidence of such coverage to the CITY prior to execution of this CONTRACT, a copy of such insurance coverage to be attached herewith:

General - The Vendor shall before commencing performance of the Contract be responsible for providing and maintaining insurance coverage in force for the life of the Contract of the kind and in adequate amounts to secure all of the obligations under the Contract and with insurance companies licensed to write insurance in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. All such insurance carried shall not be less than the kinds and amounts designated herein, and the Vendor agrees that the stipulation herein of the kinds and limits of coverage shall in no way limit the liability of the Vendor to any such kinds and amounts of insurance coverage. All policies issued shall indemnify and save harmless the City of Salem, its agents and employees from any and all claims for damages to persons or property as may rise out of the performance of this Contract.

Vendor's Comprehensive General Public Liability and Property Damage Liability Insurance - The Vendor shall carry Comprehensive General Liability Insurance providing for a limit of not less than Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) for all damages arising out of bodily injury to or death of one person, and subject to that limit for each person, a total limit of not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) for all damages arising out of bodily injuries or death of two or more persons in any one accident; and Vendor's Comprehensive Property Damage Liability Insurance providing for a limit of not less than Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) for all damages arising out of injury to or destruction of property in any one accident, and subject to that limit per accident, a total (or aggregate) limit or not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) for all damages arising out of injury to or destruction of property during the policy period.

Comprehensive Automotive and Property Damage Insurance - The Vendor shall carry Automobile Insurance covering all owned vehicles, hired vehicles or non-owned vehicles under the control of the Vendor while performing work under the Contract in the amount of not less than Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) for all damages arising out of bodily injuries to or death of one person and subject to that limit for each person, a total of not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) for all damages arising out of bodily injuries to or death of two or more persons in any one accident; and Property Damage coverage in the amount of not less than Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) for all damages to or destruction of property.

The Vendor must carry Workman's Compensation Insurance in the amounts prescribed under Massachusetts State Law and meet all other City and State Laws and Regulations.

No cancellation(s) of such insurance, whether by the insurer or by the insured party shall be valid unless written notice thereof is given by the parties proposing cancellation to the other party and to the City of Salem at least fifteen (15) days prior to the intended effective date thereof, which date shall be expressed in said notice, which shall be sent by registered mail, return receipt requested. These provisions shall apply to the legal representative(s), trustee in bankruptcy, receiver, assignee, trustee, and successor(s) in interest of the Vendor.

All insurance coverage shall be at the sole expense of the Vendor and shall be placed with such company as may be acceptable to the City of Salem and shall constitute a material part of the contract documents.

Failure to provide written proof to City and continue in force such insurance as aforesaid shall be deemed a material breach of the contract, and may constitute sufficient grounds for immediate termination of the same.

All required insurance must be endorsed to name the CITY as Additional Insured. All required insurance shall be endorsed to waive the insurer's rights of subrogation against the City. All policies and certificate for insurance must contain language that the insurance shall not be canceled, materially changed or non-renewed without at least thirty (30) days advance written notice to the CITY. The CONTRACTOR under this CONTRACT shall not allow it subcontractors to begin work until similar insurance has been so obtained and certificates of insurance approved by the CONTRACTOR.

#### ARTICLE X. CORPORATE CONTRACTOR.

If CONTRACTOR is a corporation, CONTRACTOR shall endorse the Certificate of Corporate Authority for the CONTRACTORS' signatory (Attachment C), or shall otherwise provide a form similar in nature and substance acceptable to the CITY.

If CONTRACTOR is a non-profit corporation, CONTRACTOR shall provide satisfactory proof of present status as a non-profit corporation. Such proof shall be in the form of a certification from the Massachusetts Secretary of State's office and/or from the Internal Revenue Service and shall provide the Federal Tax Identification Number of the non-profit corporation. This agreement shall not be enforceable against the CITY unless and until the CONTRACTOR complies with this section. Failure to inform the CITY in writing of revocation, or other loss of non-profit status shall be deemed a material breach of this contract and operate as an immediate termination thereof.

#### ARTICLE XI. SUBJECT TO APPROPRIATION.

The obligations of the CITY under this CONTRACT shall be subject to appropriation. In the absence of appropriation this CONTRACT shall be immediately terminated without liability for damages, penalties, or other charges.

In the requisite circumstances, the obligations of the CITY under this CONTRACT shall be subject to the formal award of the state, federal grant.

## ARTICLE XII. DOCUMENTS, MATERIALS, ETC.

Any materials, reports, information, data, etc. given to or prepared or assembled by the CONTRACTOR under this CONTRACT are to be kept confidential and shall not be made available to any individual or organization by the CONTRACTOR (except agents, servants, or employees of the CONTRACTOR) without the prior written approval of the CITY, except as otherwise required by law. The CONTRATOR understands that he/she/it may acquire or have access to "personal data" otherwise kept by the CITY. The CONTRACTOR shall comply with the provisions Chapter 66A of the General Laws of Massachusetts as it relates to public documents, and all other state and federal laws and regulations relating to confidentiality, security privacy and use of confidential data.

Any materials produced in whole or in part under this CONTRACT shall not be subject to copyright, except by the CITY, in the United States or any other country. The CITY shall have unrestricted authority to, without payment of any royalty, commission, or additional fee of any type or nature, publicly disclose, reproduce, distribute and otherwise use, and authorize other to use, in whole or in part, any reports, data or other materials prepared under this CONTRACT.

All data, reports, programs, software, equipment, furnishings, and any other documentation or product paid for by the CITY shall vest in the CITY at the termination of this CONTRACT. The CONTRACTOR shall at all times, during or after termination of this CONTRACT, obtain the prior written approval of the CITY before making any statement bearing on the work performed or data collected under this CONTRACT to the press or issues any material for publication through any medium.

# ARTICLE XIII. AUDIT, INSPECTION, RECORD KEEPING.

At any time during normal business hours, and as often as the CITY may deem it reasonably necessary, there shall be made available in the office of the CONTRACTOR for the purpose of audit, examination, and/or to make excerpts or transcripts, all records, contracts, invoices, materials, payrolls, records of personnel, conditions of employment and other data relating to all matters covered by this agreement.

Further the CONTRACTOR agrees to make its work papers, records and other evidence of audit available to the CITY for a period of three years after final payment under his CONTRACT. The CIT shall be entitled to reproduce any or all such documents at its own expense, for which provision shall be made at such time.

#### ARTICLE XIV. WEEKLY PAYROLL RECORDS REPORT.

In accordance with Massachusetts General Law c. 149, s. 27B, a true and accurate record must be kept of all individuals employed on a public works construction project for which prevailing wage rates are applicable. In addition, every contractor and subcontractor is required to submit, on a weekly basis, a copy of their weekly payroll records to the awarding authority. Once collected, the awarding authority is also required to preserve those records for three years.

#### ARTICLE XV. CONFLICT OF INTEREST.

CITY. No officer, member or employee of the CITY and no members of its governing body who exercise any function or responsibility in review or approval of the undertaking or carrying out of this CONTRACT shall participate in any decision relating to the CONTRACT which affects his/her personal interests or the interest of any corporation, partnership, or association in which he/she has a direct or indirect pecuniary interest. None of the services to be provided by the CONTRACTOR shall be used for any partisan political activity or further the election or defeat of any candidate for political office in the CITY. Compliance with this section shall be material to the CONTRACT. CONTRACTOR. CONTRACTOR agrees that his/her/its agents, servants, and employees have neither presently nor during the period of this CONTRACT any interest direct or indirect which would impair, detract, or conflict in any manner or degree with the performance of services required under this CONTRACT. The CONTRACTOR, his/her/its agents, servants or employees further stipulates that in the performance of this CONTRACT, no person having any such interest shall be employed. Conflicts of Interest include but are not limited to (a) immediate family relationships with officials of the CITY, (b) instances where the CONTRACTOR, his/her/it agents, servants or employees during the period of this CONTRACT was connected as an officer, employee or member of the governing body of the CITY, and (c) instances where the CONTRACTOR has an interest in any CITY department, its agents, servants or employees or parcels of land within the CITY. Compliance with this section shall be material to the CONTRACT.

#### ARTICLE XVI. PAYMENT.

The CITY agrees to make all reasonable efforts to pay to the CONTRACTOR the sum set forth in the CONTRACTOR'S bid or proposal within thirty (30) days of receipt of an invoice at the Office of the City Auditor detailing the work completed.

Subject to pending statutory appeal rights, CONTRACTOR agrees that all sums otherwise due and payable to the CITY for outstanding taxes, fines, fees and or other municipal charges may be deducted from the sum(s) otherwise payable under this CONTRACT prior to disbursement to the CONTRACTOR.

#### ARTICLE XVII. CONFLICT.

In the event there is a conflict between these Articles and Attachment A. Attachment A shall supersede these Articles.

#### ARTICLE XVIII. WAIVER AND AMENDMENT.

The provisions contained in this CONTRACT may be modified only as specifically provided by ATTACHMENT B - ADDITIONAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS. Amendments, or waivers of any additional term, condition, covenant, duty or obligation contained in this CONTRACT may be made only by written amendment executed by all signatories to the original agreement, prior to the effective date of the amendment.

To the extent allowed by law, all conditions, duties, and obligations contained in this CONTRACT may be waived only by written agreement by both parties.

Forbearance or indulgence in any form or manner by a party shall not be construed as a waiver, nor in any manner limit the legal or equitable remedies available to that party. No waiver by either party of any default or breach shall constitute a waiver of any subsequent default or breach of a similar or different matter.

#### ARTICLE XIX. CERTIFICATION.

An apprentice registered with DAS may be paid the lower apprentice wage rate at the applicable step as provided on the prevailing wage schedule. Any apprentice not registered with DLS/DAS regardless of whether or not they are registered with any other federal, state, local, or private agency must be paid the journeyworker's rate for the trade.
- The wage rates will remain in effect for the duration of the project, except in the case of multi-year public construction projects. For construction projects lasting longer than one year, awarding authorities must request an updated wage schedule. Awarding authorities are required to request these updates no later than two weeks before the anniversary of the date the contract was executed by the awarding authority and the general contractor. For multi-year CM AT RISK projects, awarding authority must request an annual update no later than two weeks before the anniversary date, determined as the earlier of: (a) the execution date of the GMP Amendment, or (b) the execution date of the first amendment to permit procurement of construction services. Contractors are required to obtain the wage schedules from awarding authorities, and to pay no less than these rates to covered workers. The annual update requirement is not applicable to 27F "rental of equipment" contracts.
- Every contractor or subcontractor which performs construction work on the project is required to submit weekly payroll reports and a Statement of Compliance directly to the awarding authority by mail or email and keep them on file for three years.
