

Dear Mayor Driscoll:

Due to a continued vacancy in the Deputy Director of Finance position since March, the Finance Department has required temporary contracted assistance to meet the department's ongoing responsibilities. At the end of FY2021, the Finance Department contracted with accounting firm Clifton Larsen Allen (CLA) to provide temporary assistance in fulfilling the role of Deputy Finance Director. Additionally, when the Finance department experienced turnover in its Senior Accountant/Budget Analyst role, CLA provided temporary assistance for that role, and is currently providing training to the employee who was subsequently promoted to that role.

At the time the city's FY2022 budget was finalized, the Finance Department did not expect it would need continued temporary assistance well into FY2022. Unfortunately, due to a lack of experienced, qualified candidates for the Deputy Director of Finance position (and with many similar vacancies throughout municipal government in Massachusetts), to date, the city has been unable to hire to fill that role, necessitating the continued services from CLA. The Finance Department is currently projecting over \$40,000 in savings in its Full-Time Salaries line due to the above-mentioned vacancies. This request would transfer \$40,000 from the Full-Time Salaries line to the department's Contracted Services line for the costs associated with continued services from CLA for FY2022.

RE Request for Funding: Traffic Calming Program

Dear Honorable Mayor Driscoll:

This request is for a Council Order to provide \$250,000 in funding to implement traffic calming measures along various city streets. Approval of these funds would allow the City to install sixteen asphalt speed humps on four streets within North Salesa (Buffum Street, Bez Street, Bezstow Street, and Dunlap Street) as well as purchase and install temporary speed humps and speed cushions along Columbus Avenue (Bayview Ave to Fort Ave), Federal Street (North St to Boston St), Mall Street (N. Washington Sq to Bridge St) and Proctor Street (Mansell Pkwy to Highland Ave).

Since launching the Traffic Calming Program in 2018, the Traffic & Parking Department has received over 30 requests and have been able to implement traffic calming projects at over 15 streets and/or intersections throughout the city. In most cases, the interventions resulted in reduced travel speeds and perceived improvements in safety from the neighborhoods who requested them. For example, in the North Salem neighborhood, the data shows that on Dunlap Street the percentage of vehicles driving over the speed limit decreased eignificantly from 56% to 11%. It is also important to note that the average daily vehicle volume on Dunlap Street remained nearly the same with 851 vehicles pre-installation and 805 vehicles while the temporary speed humps were in place.

In addition to these locations, the Department will continue to evaluate other requests and will be seeking funds in the PY23 budget to hire consultants, prepare design plans and purchase materials to continue piloting traffic calming measures as well as making some of these measures permanent. Our Department is also working in conjunction with the Planning and Engineering Departments to implement permanent safety improvements to the Point neighborhood along Congress St as part of \$3.25 million Mass Works Grant. Traffic Calming Program Overview

The City of Salem's Neighborhood Traffic Calming Program was established in 2018. The goal of the program is to implement small-scale, semi-permanent measures in order to reduce vehicle speeds and enhance safety for all roadway users including motorists, pedestrians, cyclists, etc. Less costly materials such as temporary speed humps, flex posts, signage and roadway striping can be utilized to test their effectiveness before determining whether to proceed with more expensive and permanent infrastructure upgrades.

Proponent(s) are asked to submit an application along with a petition from the neighborhood. This assists City staff with the intake of these requests and gives a sense of the magnitude of the issue(s) being raised. Once a request is received, Traffic & Parking Department staff work with the Police Department to collect traffic volume and speed data. Staff also review any crash data that may be available over a five-year period as well as conduct a "street diagnostic". This involves identifying all of the traffic ordinances that have been adopted by City Council on a particular roadway or intersection and comparing it to any existing signage. In addition, staff check with the Engineering Department to see if any road or sidewalk work is planned for the area including any utility installations or upgrades.

To further assist with the evaluation of each request, City staff have created a priority tool, utilizing Geographic Information System (GIS), which is a data mapping software system. The tool is split into four different criteria which considers surrounding demographics, land uses, crash history, and the speed and volume data collected by the Police Department. Visit https://traffic-calming-1-salemma.hub.arcgis.com/ to explore the prioritization tool.

Evaluating the results of the priority tool along with the other gathered information assists with determining whether traffic calming measures are deemed necessary and how soon resources can be allocated. Traffic calming is an iterative process and not a "one-size fits all" method, which may involve the use of different interventions to address an identified issue on a given street or intersection. City staff work to apply a context sensitive approach that considers pedestrian/cyclist activity, density of development, adjacent land uses as well as overall traffic flow when developing recommendations.

Once measures are implemented, staff collect additional data and observe the location to determine how effective the measures are or if other interventions need to be applied. Since launching the program in 2018, the Traffic & Parking Department has received over 30 requests and have been able to implement traffic calming projects at over 15 streets and/or intersections throughout the city. In most cases, the

interventions resulted in reduced travel speeds and perceived improvements in safety from the neighborhoods who requested them.

For example, in the North Salem neighborhood, speed humps and 20 mph speed limit signs were installed on Buffum, Barr, Barstow, and Dunlap Streets. The data shows that on Dunlap Street, the highest-recorded vehicle speed dropped from 65 mph to 48 mph, the average speed dropped from 26 mph to 20 mph, and the percent of vehicles driving over the speed limit decreased from 56% to 11%. It is also important to note that the average daily vehicle volume on Dunlap Street remained nearly the same with 851 vehicles pre-installation and 805 vehicles while the elements were in place.

Due to the success of the temporary installations at these locations, the Traffic & Parking Department is working to construct permanent speed humps in North Salem, which will be in place year-round. During this coming season, we will be re-installing speed humps along Chestnut Street, installing speed cushions on Valley Street, and are in the process of evaluating the effectiveness of materials placed on Cedar, Fairfield, and Gardner Streets from this past year. In addition, staff are working with on-call consultants to develop design plans with the goal of implementing measures this calendar year along the following roadways: Columbus Avenue, Federal Street, Mall Street, N. Washington Square, Proctor Street and the intersection of Franklin Street/Moulton Avenue/Orchard Street/Osborne Street.

Evaluating traffic calming requests may result in staff recommending the need for further study and analysis. In these instances, consultants are hired to perform traffic studies which involve a more in-depth assessment of traffic patterns, speeds as well as pedestrian and bicycle activity. Currently the Department is working with a consultant to evaluate the intersections of Tremont Street/Grove Street and Tremont Street/School Street and have engaged another traffic engineering firm to begin putting a scope together focusing on Broad Street including the intersections with Dalton Parkway/Flint Street and Winthrop Street. There are also times when survey work is needed to begin the process of developing more detailed design plans to address identified safety and accessibility issues. The Traffic & Parking Department is working in conjunction with the Engineering Department on several intersections throughout the city with the goal of constructing safer and ADA compliant crosswalks and sidewalks.

We are requesting an allocation of \$90,000 in Short-Term Capital for the purpose of hiring an interdisciplinary team to develop a strategy and plan for the provision of downtown Salem's future public parking infrastructure and any associated development opportunities over the midto long-term.

The plan will serve as a key resource, a 'road map', for decision-making regarding changes to the parking system, redevelopment opportunities, and financing approach. Because of the long-term nature, the analysis needs to consider the eventual replacement of existing structured public parking (e.g., Museum Place and South Harbor Garages) as well as a possible paradigm shift in parking demands that takes into account advancements in vehicle technology as well as the introduction and expansion of other mobility options. The scope involves analyzing several sites for possible parking structures and will include an analysis of which sites are most cost effective for new parking configuration could improve circulation and will identify which sites are likely to best lend themselves to development in addition to parking. A preliminary list of potential sites includes the Universal Steel Lot at 297 Bridge Street, Riley Plaza at 212 Washington Street, Klop Alley/Front Street, and Church Street – East and West surface lots. An expanded conceptual development study of the Klop Alley/Front Street lot is also needed and could be a second phase of this project if appropriate. Near-term recommendations on potential regulatory and operational changes are also to be included.

Staff in the Department of Planning and Community Development ('DPCD') and the Traffic and Parking Department ('TPD') have worked collaboratively to define a project scope that, when undertaken by the interdisciplinary team, will result in a comprehensive document that both

departments can use to guide future development projects to meet the city's parking goals and needs.

DPCD's preliminary conversations with traffic consultants have resulted in an estimated cost of \$90,000. This estimate accounts for the need for a truly interdisciplinary team that can examine not only the physical characteristics of subject properties and their suitability for structured parking, but also the economic feasibility of various structured parking and mixed-use scenarios for each of the sites.

Ladies and Gentlemen of the City Council:

In 1983 the Massachusetts Legislature adopted a condominium conversion law in response to a surge of conversions. The law allows for municipalities to adopt condominium conversion ordinances to prevent displacement by providing protections for tenants that reside in buildings with four or more units. For example, the ordinance can require landlords that convert their rental units into condominiums to provide their tenants with notification and assistance with relocation costs.

For municipalities to adopt a condo conversion ordinance, local legislative action must be accompanied by a declaration in the form of findings where local conditions constitute an acute rental housing emergency requiring local action.

The City, through our Affordable Housing Trust Fund Board and the work of our Department of Planning and Community Development, has studied the conversion rates in Salem and has found that the pace of condominium conversions in our community has steadily increased over the past six years while housing costs continues to rise. In this analysis, we found that 78% of apartments converted since 2016 are two- or three-family homes. Salem is rapidly losing its two- and three-family housing stock to conversions and therefore there is an acute need to protect tenants in building with two or more units.

The 1983 state law, however, only allows communities to provide tenant protection to tenants in buildings with four or more housing units. Absent a special act of the legislature, local action cannot lower this threshold. To that end, the proposed home rule petition would enable Salem to adopt a condominium conversion and tenant protection Ordinance that offers protections to Salem residents in buildings with two or more units.

The home rule petition also proposes a right of first refusal for tenants to purchase their converted units at market rate, and a second right of refusal for the City or a nonprofit to purchase the unit at market rate and to establish the unit as permanently affordable.

The full condominium conversion and tenant protection Ordinance will be filed with the City Council upon the successful adoption by the state legislature of the special act called for in this petition.

Ordered:

That a petition to the General Court, accompanied by a bill for authorization to enact a local condominium conversion ordinance for the purposes of tenant stability and maintaining the general welfare of Salem residents, as set forth below, be filed with an attested copy of this Order be, and hereby is approved to the end that the following legislation be adopted, except for amendments by the Senate or House of Representatives which conform to the intent of this home rule petition:

AN ACT authorizing the City of Salem to enact a condominium conversion ordinance for buildings containing two or more residential units.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court Assembled, and by the authority of the same as follows:

AN ACT RELATIVE TO A CONDOMINIMUM CONVERSION ORDINANCE IN THE CITY OF SALEM.

SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or special law to the contrary, the City of Salem City Council by majority vote may enact an ordinance to regulate the conversion of housing accommodations in the municipality to the condominium or cooperative form or ownership in buildings containing two or more residential units.

SECTION 2. Such ordinance may include, but is not limited to: (i) provisions for investigations and hearings on condominium conversions or proposed conversions; (ii) a permit process; (iii) tenant notification requirements; (iv) relocation costs for tenants and other measures to protect tenants; (v) control of evictions; (vi) penalties for violation of the ordinance; and (vii) afford tenants and the City or the City's Designee the right to purchase the residential property in which the tenant(s) reside(s) when the residential property is being offered for sale.

SECTION 3. The ordinance may establish a condominium review board or vest administrative duties in an existing municipal board, commission, or office. The review board may exercise such powers as it is given by the ordinance.

SECTION 6. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
