Dear Mayor Driscoll,

This letter is to request a transfer in the amount of \$3,722.00 from the golf course receipts reserve (2436) to Renovation/Repairs line (16512-5846) for completion of the Pump house project.

O'Connor Pumps is currently working on the pump house project and are recommending replacing two 15 HP pumps and one motor. These were not included in the original bid/request, because at the time they were functional. But after consulting with Paul and O'Connor, the pump motor is coming to the end of its life and they recommend replacing it now. During the work, it was discovered that the pump casings were corroded and impellers were worn. This will cause lower water output than they are normally capable of producing.

It will be cost effective for the City and will save about \$2000 by replacing them now while they are in the midst of doing the work. Between the previous electronic upgrade, and now the pipes, valves and the pumps, everything will be new and functioning at full capacity.

Thank you for your attention to this matter.



Ladies and Gentlemen of the City Council:

The enclosed Order appropriates \$64,050 from our capital outlay account to fund the purchase of replacement and new turnout gear for the Salem Fire Department. These funds will be combined with \$29,000 in emergency management grant funds to enable the department to replace 30 sets of gear beyond the standard number we normally replace in a given year.

This additional quantity is due to the current equipment either reaching the end of its scheduled lifespan or the gear being needed for the ten new firefighters we have added to the department's ranks over the last two years. We would normally incorporate this funding into the regular capital budget, but given the availability of these grant funds and the timing of the lifespan on the current gear, we are making this appropriation request mid-fiscal year.

While we are obligated to provide this critical safety equipment for our firefighters on the basis of our collective bargaining contract with them, I hope you will agree that we ought to ensure our firefighters and first responders have the gear and equipment they require regardless. I recommend adoption of the enclosed Order and invite you to contact Chief Cody directly with any questions you may have regarding it.

Dear Mayor Driscoll:

During our recent round of negotiations, the subject of turn out gear became a key topic. Since 1997 our collective bargaining agreement (CBA) has read "As budget funding will allow, each employee shall be furnished with two (2) complete sets of turn out clothing (coat, trousers and suspenders) to allow rotation, cleaning and repair." We have maintained this policy to the best of our ability up to now.

In 2007 we applied for and received an Assistance to firefighter grant to replace a large number of our turn out sets. We are now at the ten year mark, a NFPA standard for the retirement of turnout clothing.

This year, like last, I have used our Emergency Management Planning Grant (EMPG) money to replace \$29,000 dollars of gear along with our regular protective clothing budget line. This year we need to replace 30 additional sets of gear due to either their expiration date or to supply a second set of gear for new hires. We have had 10 new hires in the last two years. Each set of Globe turn out gear is purchased from Bergeron Protective Clothing (who is on the State bid list) for \$2,135.00.

I respectfully request a supplemental appropriation of \$64,050.00 from the short term CIP fund to support this purchase using the current language from our CBA "The Chief shall include in his annual budget request funds sufficient to provide each firefighter with two (2) sets turn out clothing (coat, trousers, and suspenders) to allow rotation, cleaning and repair and to provide for replacement of gear in excess of ten (10) years in order to comply with NFPA standards."

Ladies and Gentlemen of the City Council:

As you may recall, late last year we issued a request for proposals for a high-speed fiber internet provider and we received one response, from SiFi. Their proposal was reviewed by a committee consisting of City staff, City Councillor Josh Turiel, and a community resident with expertise in the industry, and it was found to satisfy the requirements of the RFP.

SiFi intends to install a fiber network that will provide high-speed internet service to any home or business that wishes to purchase it. SiFi will not be the internet service provider, however: they will construct the network and then lease it to one or more ISPs, who will offer the service to customers. The entire network must be constructed within 48 months of the execution of their required agreements. Such a network would offer competition to our local internet service provider, giving residents greater choice and bolstering our local economy.

The majority of the installation will be done using micro-trenching, a minimally invasive technique that consists of a one- to two-inch-wide trench in the roadway near the curb, deep enough to get under the asphalt. In some locations, conventional trenching may be required, however it is a last resort. In other places, SiFi will utilize the existing storm and sanitary sewer system to run the fiber. Terms in the agreement protect the City's sewer system and require network maintenance to be the responsibility of company. In all places where either conventional or micro-trenching is utilized the company will restore the roadway or sidewalk to its original materials condition. With conventional trenching on roadways paved within the last five years, a full curb-to-curb repaving is required. SiFi and their contractor will meet on a regular basis with staff from the Engineering Department to review the work planned for each road and restoration plans for that roadway.

We are currently negotiating the terms of a Fiber Optic Network Installation Agreement with the company. This agreement is, effectively, a master street-opening permit for the city, which will require the City Council's review and approval. The terms of the Agreement are primarily

focused on the construction and restoration protocols, though other components are also included, such as termination, liability, and so forth. To help us ensure the document protects the City to the greatest extent feasible we retained specialized legal counsel – Davis, Malm & D'Agostine, P.C. – to assist us.

In addition, City departments including Police, Fire/Emergency Management, Information Technology, Traffic and Parking, Engineering, and Schools have begun meeting with SiFi to review the options available to us for smart city enhancements and connections, which will be possible as a result of the fiber network's construction. These connection points will allow for a wide variety of public service enhancements, such as smart street and traffic light controls, flood sensors in catch basins, improved video camera feeds for public safety, enhanced radio communications for first responders, and the availability of free or discounted Wi-Fi internet service for Salem Public School students in their home.

The opportunities that a city-wide fiber network present are truly exciting. We look forward to completing our legal negotiations with SiFi and presenting you with a proposed agreement in the coming weeks. No action is required at this time, but if you have specific questions, concerns or ideas about the fiber network, smart city elements, the construction of the network, microtrenching, and so forth, please feel free to contact my office. We have a team working on these matters and expect to bring an agreement to the City Council later this year.
