Dear Mayor Driscoll,

Mr. David Desrosiers, resident at 25 Foch Street, Cambridge, Massachusetts has submitted his application for renewal of his constable license for the City of Salem (see enclosure).

The required criminal indices checks on Mr. Desrosiers have been completed and no derogatory information which would preclude him from reappointment as a constable was surfaced. I interviewed him on January 7th, 2019, during which he reaffirmed his responsibilities to comply with the requirements of the Salem City Ordinance, Chapter 32, Section 19 (as amended on 15 May 2017).

Mr. Desrosiers has been a constable for approximately four years and has served as a constable with the City of Salem since 2015. He is employed by Desrosiers Associates, LLC, 501 Cambridge Street, Suite 204, Cambridge, Massachusetts. Most of his work is in the Salem, Beverly, Peabody area. Prior to becoming a full-time constable, he was the Chief Procurement Officer for the Cambridge Housing Authority.

Mr. Desrosiers does not maintain a license to carry (LTC) or firearms identification card (FID) and therefore does not carry a firearm in the performance of his duties. He is not a member of any professional constable association or organization. He believes that licensed constables should be required to undergo standardized training and would participate in same if City or State mandated training requirements were developed and implemented.

Based on the information supplied by Mr. Desrosiers on his application, the results of his criminal history checks and my January 7th, 2019 interview with him, Mr. Desrosiers meets the standards for reappointment and continued service as a constable with the City of Salem.

Mr. Desrosiers' application is hereby forwarded for your review, consideration and presentation to the City Council should you elect to reappoint him.





Ladies and Gentlemen of the City Council:

The enclosed resolutions express support for the Superintendent of the Salem Public Schools to submit formal Statements of Interest (SOI) to the Massachusetts School Building Authority (MSBA).

The SOIs outline and formalize the City's intention to seek MSBA funding for two projects: Phase 2 of the Salem High School work and a variety of necessary work at the Bates Elementary School, including façade repairs, HVAC and boiler systems, energy management equipment, roof repairs, and other related work. Each project requires a separate SOI and, therefore, separate Council resolutions are necessary. As you know, the SOI is a routine measure that the MSBA requires from both the School Committee and the City Council in order for the district to be eligible to apply for funding.

While a SOI is a prerequisite condition for applying for funding, it in no way guarantees that our applications to MSBA will be approved or that funding will be provided. Neither does it commit the district or the City to budgeting or expending any funds for this project at this time. In the interest of keeping our school buildings and renovation program moving forward in a positive direction, I strongly encourage support for this resolution, which is a requirement for the MSBA to consider our SOI. The MSBA requires the SOI be submitted before the close of business on April 11; therefore, I am requesting the City Council vote on these resolutions at your meeting of March 28.
