

















Tree Diagram



Edward L. Leathers was born on November 13, 1934, and lived at 7 Jusper Screen in Summerific, Stelleft high school to join the U.S. Army during World War II on April 2, 1943.

While in the mehrary, he was trained at Fort Kaos and Camp Campbell, Kertucky, with the 2nd Armored Division, known as the "Hell on Wheels Division." He caved under General Parson along with the Eine and 181st Authorne Divisions in the Caropean Theater of Operations. In his two years of watering acrosse, he participated in five major battles including the Bantie of the Bulge (Artennes), Normandy, Newhern France, Bhankland, and Central Europe. He also pertripated in the Userwion of Preside, Helland, and Belgium, and was a member of the Heavy Guard for President Trainess when he male into Berley for the Possilen Conference.

For his courage and complary service, PPC Edward Leaders was awarded the Good Conduct Medal, the European-African-Middle Batters Campungs World Again and Sward War 15 Victory Medal. 


