Purpose

- To obtain citizen comments on Salem's housing, community and economic development needs for low- to moderateincome residents and neighborhoods, in order to begin preparation of the annual Action Plan.
- The Action Plan is a 1-year document that outlines activities to be undertaken in FY22 (July 1, 2021 – June 30, 2022), based on priorities from the 5-Year Consolidated Plan & any new needs/priorities identified



Estimated Funding

- The FY22 allocations have not yet been released by the U.S. Dept. of Housing & Urban Development (HUD).
- FY21 estimates:
 - \$1,098,908 in Community Development Block Grant funds (CDBG)
 - \$168,650 in Home Investment Partnership funds (HOME)
 - \$74,000 in CDBG program income



HOW CAN THE CITY SPEND ITS FUNDS?

NATIONAL OBJECTIVES

- Benefit low- to moderate-income people, including job creation
- Prevent or eliminate slums or blighting conditions
- 3. Address a critical community need

- Housing
- Economic development

- Planning & administration



WHAT IS LOW to MODERATE INCOME (LMI)?

- Varies by household size and geographic region
- Income limits set annually by HUD
- Applies to households or neighborhoods

NEIGHBORHOOD IMPROVEMENTS

- Street and Sidewalk / Tree Planting
- Park/Playground Improvements
- Public Facilities (i.e. firehouse, teen center, schools, homeless facility)
- Infrastructure (i.e. removal of barriers, bike paths, public art)

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

- Small Business Financial Assistance Programs
- Business Technical Assistance


