# 5. Kristin Carlson presents Harbor Light Community Partners mural proposal for 43 Boston St. Motion to support the project.

- Harbor Lights build studio apartments for those coming out of homelessness
- There is a billboard that needs to be utilized and vandalized and they would like to have a mural that symbolizes the transformation of the building.
- There was a community meeting between residents and employees to discuss and approve the public art piece
- Ruben presented a sketch that creates a tree made of ethnically diverse hands that "hold up" the building features. There are birds each chosen for their symbolism and a nest that signifies the home for the residents "learning to fly"
- Community and local businesses have been invited to come an celebrate the new art on October 18th
- The entire project will be documented
