Derby Street Phase 1 upgrades


Sidewalk Improvements

- > Update pedestrian ramps
- > Install tactile warning panels
- Refresh cross walk locations
- Repairs
 - Provide 4' minimum sidewalks
 - Provide 3' minimum clear width using bump outs and removing select trees/obstacles
 - Reduce cross slopes to work towards ADA compliance
 - Provide waterproof membrane at sidewalk joints against buildings

Street Tree Concept - Phase 1


- 6 trees removed

Existing Street Tree Treatments

Sidewalk Bump-outs

- Sidewalks moved to outside of tree
- Allows 3' minimum ADA access



Treatment for Existing Street Trees

Flexi-pave

- Made from rubber, stone, binding agent
- Porous to allow air and water to tree roots
- Forms around existing tree roots
- Various color options







New Street Trees

Syringa reticulata 'Ivory Silk' / Japanese Tree Lilac

Height: 20'-25' Width: 15'-20' Bloom: May-June Fall Color: Yellow to Green

Malus "Adirondack" / Adirondack Crabapple

Height: 20'-25' Width: 15'-20' Bloom: April-May Fall Color: Orange to Red

Historic Recognition of Derby Street


- Medallions added to sidewalk surface











Parking – Existing





EXISTING ILLEGAL PARKING SPACE BY MUTCD STANDARDS (9)


- Total number of parking spaces on Derby Street
 - 18 spaces legal
 - 9 spaces illegal (w/in 20ft of intersection and 4ft from driveways)

- Spaces removed due to trees 2
- Spaces removed due to bike lane 2
- Spaces removed due to stairs (ADA clearance) 1

Bicycle Accommodations


<u>On – Road Improvements</u>

- Bike lanes have been provided on Derby Street from Washington Street to Orange Street
- Right side buffered bike lane will be proposed from Orange Street to Webb Street

On-road bike accommodations

Derby Street minimum width: 25 ft

- Reduce parking stall width to 7-8 ft
- Reduce travel lane to 10.5 ft
- Reduce bike lane to 5 ft
- Provide a 1.5 ft 2.5 ft buffer.
- Clear width for emergency access: 16 ft
